The saying "Change Starts with One" holds a special meaning for me, as it all began with one dog: Printz.

He was my first rescue, a beautiful German shepherd who I found abandoned and badly injured in a local park. Printz had been in a dog fight and desperately needed help. I carried him back to my parents' apartment, where, with love and care, he made a full recovery and became my loyal companion.

This experience opened my eyes to the harsh realities faced by countless animals in Romania. Despite only speaking Romanian and having no experience with computers, I felt compelled to do more, leading to the creation of ROLDA.

From the very beginning, I realized how crucial international support would be, and with time, ROLDA has grown. Today, we are registered in the US, Australia, the UK, and several European countries, including Romania. The support we've received has been truly inspiring people have donated, left legacies, volunteered, fostered, and adopted, enabling us to extend our help not just to dogs, but to cats and other animals as well, giving these innocent creatures a voice that resonates worldwide.

When we heard the devastating news that war had broken out just across the border in Ukraine, we knew many animals would suffer as a result. Leveraging our location and expertise, and with the invaluable support of our community, we have worked tirelessly to alleviate suffering in these challenging times.









History of ROLDA



1999

In 1999, Dana established ROLDA in Galati, a city with approximately 30,000 stray dogs freely roaming the streets and lacking any sterilization initiatives.

2003

In the year 2003, ROLDA acquired a plot of land in the neighbouring village of Smardan for the purpose of constructing a shelter to house rescued dogs. In addition, they have established a formal agreement with a local veterinarian to organize and implement sterilization campaigns.

2005

In the year 2005, Dana participated in a shelter management course at Dog's Trust in London. At this point, ROLDA had already established its initial kennels, taking cues from the UK model. These kennels were designed to provide insulated spaces, shielding the dogs from the severe Romanian winters.

2006

The ROLDA Foundation obtained official NGO registration in Romania in 2006 and established itself as an incorporated charity in the United States, operating as the Romanian League in Defense of Animals, Inc. In that very year, Dana introduced a dog named Bela to the United States, thus becoming the first ROLDA dog to be internationally adopted and initiating our global adoption endeavors.

2007

In the year 2007, we established a significant shelter with the aim of rescuing a portion of the 10,000 stray dogs inhabiting a vast steel plant, which was under the ownership of Lakshmi Mittal at that time. Prior to ROLDA's intervention, a considerable number of these dogs were subjected to poisoning.

2010

As of 2010, a total of four additional paddocks were constructed at the expansive sanctuary. This led to a total of 12 paddocks, resulting in 120 kennels. The facility has expanded its capacity to accommodate a maximum of 700 dogs.

2012

In the year 2012, our company embarked on an international expansion by establishing a new branch in Norway, which operates under the name ROLDA - Gatehunder fra Romania.

2014

Subsequently, branches were established in Switzerland (Association ROLDA Suisse), Sweden (Association ROLDA Sverige), and Australia (ROLDA Inc) in 2014.

2015

In 2015, our UK branch, ROLDA UK, was established, and in 2016, we commemorated the 10th anniversary of ROLDA.

2020

The year 2020 marked a significant achievement for ROLDA, as they saved a total of 20,000 animals.

2022

Following the onset of the war in Ukraine in 2022, ROLDA swiftly coordinated its response to aid animals adversely affected by the conflict. In that very year, we successfully finished the construction of our inaugural sanctuary, exclusively designed for senior and disabled felines.

2023

Our sanctuary for disabled and senior cats welcomed its first guests, offering them a safe and loving home. We transitioned small shelters to green energy by installing solar panels, which will help reduce electric bills for years to come. We enhanced our grounds by hiring a landscaping company to install a new lawn, eliminating dangerous foxtails. This new lawn includes an irrigation system and plants that help keep mosquitoes away from our dogs and cats. To improve the living conditions for our dogs, we installed new ventilation and heating systems in the small shelter. We purchased new land near the small shelter to minimise noise complaints from neighbours and to allow for future expansion. We continued providing emergency support for #UkraineAnimals.

The local administration delayed the PawzUp project because of plans to build a road where our shelter is located, which means we will have to relocate.

2024

We reached a heart-warming milestone: over 40,000 animals have been helped since ROLDA began. We expanded our financial support to six small NGOs in Romania and over 40 rescuers in Ukraine. Thanks to a wonderfully generous gift left to us in a will by a supporter in Australia, ROLDA could purchase 8.9 hectares of land. We will construct nine buildings on the land within four phases to complete the PawzUp Center.

HOW WE WORK



- * ROLDA UK operates as a subsidiary of ROLDA, a non-profit organization committed to aiding mistreated and abandoned animals in Romania. The primary goals of our UK branch encompass the solicitation of donations, the raising of awareness regarding ROLDA's initiatives, and the management of international fostering and adoption efforts.
- ROLDA provides care for hundreds of dogs and cats in Romania through three shelters located in the southeastern region of the country. Additionally, we provide aid to communities facing challenges in pet care, offer support to other rescues through provisions, medicines, and financial assistance, and conduct educational campaigns across Romania.
- Given the proximity of our shelters to the Ukrainian border, we have leveraged our advantageous location and expertise to extend support to animals affected by the ongoing conflict. This support entails providing financial aid and distributing essential supplies to rescues across the war-torn country.



ACHIEVEMENTS

The achievements of ROLDA fill us with great pride. I am pleased to provide a brief overview of our successes.

- Our organization has constructed **three shelters for animals**, and we are proud to announce that our first shelter has been nominated for the prestigious 'Best Dog Shelter' award in Romania on three separate occasions.
- We organize educational initiatives targeting individuals across various age groups.
- Our organization offers complimentary sterilization programs aimed at assisting pets residing in underserved communities, particularly those in rural regions. These initiatives are conducted in collaboration with local veterinarians.
- The #ForeverFriends Campaign was established to acknowledge the invaluable companionship that pets offer, particularly to the elderly. Its aim is to **assist** seniors in caring for their beloved pets.

- Our advocacy efforts focus on the closure of public pounds in Romania notorious for neglecting, mistreating, and euthanizing captured dogs, as well as taking proactive measures against animal abuse such as the practice of chaining dogs.
- Educational Tools: The "Speak Toto's Language" initiative has been established with the purpose of enabling children to interpret the body language of stray dogs and engage with them safely.
- Additionally, we distribute ROLDA coloring books to educate children on pet care, nurturing a future generation of animal advocates.





AGGRESSIVENESS

An aggressive dog stands firm with its head, tail, and hackles (the hair that runs along the spine, from head to tail) raised. Its eyes may be wide open, and its upper lip lifted to show its fangs.



AGITATION / PLAYFULNESS

A dog that wants to play will wag its tail in excitement, and may even move its whole behind while doing so. It will bark playfully to draw your attention and I may assume the "throw me a toy" position – with its front paws spread, head bowed, and backside raised, wagging its tail constantly.



CURIOSITY

A curious dog may appear restless. Its head constantly moving left to right, following the object of its interest. Also, curious dogs tend to excessively sniff a new item or even "try it out" by touching it with a paw.



FEAR

A scared dog will bow its head and a tuck its tail, its demeanor submissive. This is sometimes accompanied by intense shaking.



JOY

Happy dogs tend to be very "vocal" and expressive. They can bark loudly, hop, and take rapid breaths with open mouths. Dogs are easily excited and may do this if they receive treats or a new toy, if there is the possibility of taking a walk, or if their human returns home. Simply hearing their human's voice or catching their scent can make a dog euphoric.

RELAXATION

A relaxed dog will lay in a comfortable position: curied up, on its stomach, or on its back with its paws up. It may go into a deep sleep, snore loudly, or even move its paws while it dreams.



UNCERTAINTY/DISTRUST

You may notice distrusting behavior in animals recently rescued from the streets or after being removed from an unsuitable environment. These dogs may be happy to see you at first and may even accept some gestures of affection like a pat on the head or some treats, only to back away to a safe distance a few minutes later.



GUILT

When caught doing something they shouldn't a dog will often adopt a gulty expression; head bowed, giving the 'puppy dog' eyes, while wagging its tail timidly in an attempt to soften its human's heart.



SHYNES

Shy dogs have a habit of keeping their heads lowered to avoid eye contact. In stressful situations they may hide, actively seek a place of comfort and they may even whine to express their unease. It would be best to approach such a dog slowly, using a soothing tone so as not to enhance their discomfort.



DEFENSIVE

The difference between this stance and the aggressive one is the lack of dominance as the tail is tucked — a clear sign of fear. In this situation, it is best to give the animal some space and the chance to escape the situation it perceives as threatening.



Helping #UkraineAnimals in the war:

- As a result of the initiation of the war in Ukraine, our efforts have benefited approximately 25,000 animals;
- We have issued small grants to a total of 40 rescuers;
- Distributed over 60 tons of food and medicines nationwide;
- Facilitated the reconstruction of five shelters that were damaged by bombings;
- Sponsored six sterilization campaigns;
- And financed the urgent relocation of animals from the flooded area in Kherson during the summer of 2023.

ROLDA SMALL SHELTER FOR DOGS

ROLDA Small Shelter for Dogs represents our inaugural shelter, where we have managed to rescue countless dogs who were abandoned, malnourished, exposed to harsh conditions, injured, and subjected to mistreatment.

The shelter has the capacity to house a maximum of 70 dogs and provides separate play areas, ICU recovery units, and a grooming area to ensure their well-being.

In the year 2023, the installation of solar panels transformed it into a Green Energy Shelter.

































ROLDA LARGE SHELTER FOR DOGS



In response to the increasing demand, we have constructed the ROLDA Large Shelter, capable of accommodating up to 700 dogs.

Despite the hurdles, which encompassed a legal battle and technical complications, the shelter has served as a vital lifeline for a multitude of animals.

Our current situation necessitates immediate action as we are obligated to find new homes for a substantial number of dogs, owing to the construction of a new road.



ROLDA SANCTUARY FOR DISABLED OR SENIOR CATS



The ROLDA Sanctuary provides a safe haven for disabled or senior cats in Romania, where they frequently encounter challenging circumstances.

Our cattery places particular emphasis on providing care for senior and disabled felines, accommodating a maximum capacity of 40 cats.

The establishment consists of segregated spaces for isolation and socialization, alongside an outdoor area for the purpose of ventilation and physical exercise.
